The Complainant submits this complaint to the Court and states that there is probable cause to believe Defendant committed the following offense(s):

COUNT I

Charge: Drugs - 2nd Degree - Possess 6 Grams or More Cocaine/Heroin/Meth

Minnesota Statute: 152.022.2(a)(1), with reference to: 152.022.3(a)

Maximum Sentence: 25 years and/or \$500,000

Offense Level: Felony

Charge: Obstruct Legal Process-Interfere w/Peace Officer

On or about November 17, 2015, in the County of Blue Earth, said Defendant, Jeremy Richard Ullrich did, intentionally, obstruct, resist, or interfere with a peace officer while the officer was engaged in the performance of official duties and the act was accompanied by force or violence or the threat thereof.

COUNT IV

Charge: Theft-Take/Use/Transfer Movable Prop-No Consent

Minnesota Statute: 609.52.2(a)(1)

Maximum Sentence: 90 days and/or \$1,000

Offense Level: Misdemeanor

On or about November 17, 2015, in the County of Blue Earth, said Defendant, Jeremy Richard Ullrich did, intentionally and without claim of right, take, use, transfer, conceal or retain possession of the movable property of another without the other's consent and with intent to deprive the owner permanently of possession of the property.

STATEMENT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

On November 17, 2015, at approximately 6:37 p.m., Officer Christopher Arkell with the Mankato Department of Public Safety responded to a shoplifting complaint at the Mills Fleet Farm located in Mankato, Minnesota.

On arrival, Officer Arkell made contact with the complainant, Adult 1, an employee of Fleet Farm's loss protection division. Adult 1 had Jeremy Richard Ullrich in custody for shoplifting a pair of Dewalt gloves and a tape measure. Ullrich said he did not mean to steal the items but had forgotten they were in his pockets. Due to the potential for additional stolen items on Ullrich's person, Officer Arkell advised him he would be searching him. Ullrich began putting his wallet and phone back in his pockets. Officer Arkell told him not to reach into his pockets and put his hands behind his back. Ullrich continued to dig into his pockets. Officer Arkell grabbed onto his arm, and Ullrich pulled away from Officer Arkell. Officer Arkell directed Ullrich to put his hands behind his back. Ullrich pushed Officer Arkell back, attempting to get past Officer Arkell and to the door. Officer Arkell next struck Ullrich in the chest with an open hand as Ullrich began trying to push past the loss prevention associate. Ullrich continued to actively resist Officer Arkell's commands; and due to the potential of harm to the staff, Officer Arkell, and Ullrich, Officer Arkell decided to use his tazer to subdue Ullrich.

Ullrich went to the ground immediately upon the tazer being deployed into his back. At this point, Officer Arkell and Adult 1 were able to place Ullrich into handcuffs. Ullrich was searched incident to arrest, and Officer Arkell located a clear Ziploc plastic baggie containing a white crystalline substance that was later field tested as methamphetamine by Officer Matt Vitale of the Mankato Department of Public Safety. Additionally, a small plastic straw with a white residue that also NIK tested as methamphetamine was located. Ullrich had a wallet and a leather coin pouch on his person. In the coin pouch was over \$3,000.00. Upon returning to the Public Safety Center, Officer Vitale was able to verify the crystal-type substance was methamphetamine; and its weight was approximately 8.6 grams without the baggie.

Officer Arkell obtained a report narrative from the loss prevention associate at Mills Fleet Farm. According to Adult 1, on November 17, Adult 1 observed a subject, later identified as Jeremy Ullrich, via the store surveillance system. Ullrich was in the building department and selected Dewalt gloves. Ullrich then exited the aisle and proceeded to a different aisle in the store. Ullrich was seen trying the gloves on while popping the tags off the gloves. Ullrich concealed the gloves under the coat he was carrying. Ullrich then selected a tape measure and proceeded to shop around the store and then entered the bathroom. Adult 1 waited for Ullrich to leave the bathroom to inspect it for any merchandise or tags. Upon inspection, Adult 1 found that the package for the tape measure was hidden in the garbage can. Adult 1 maintained continual observation of Ullrich. Ullrich proceeded to the front of the store, passing all points of sale, making no attempt to pay for the concealed gloves and tape measure. Ullrich exited the store, at which time, Adult 1 and an assistant manager approached Ullrich and identified themselves as staff from Mills Fleet Farm. Ullrich apologized for the incident and asked if he could just pay for the items. Adult 1 told Ullrich they would have to talk about it in the office. According to Adult 1, Ullrich seemed intoxicated. Ullrich produced the concealed merchandise and was escorted back into the loss prevention office and presented his ID. At this point in time, Officer Arkell arrived. Mills Fleet Farm is not requesting restitution as the items were retained. The combined value of the stolen items is \$49.98.

Ullrich has prior controlled substance convictions, with dates off offense of 1/14/04 (07-CR-04-540) and 2/01/15 (07-CR-15-466.)

SIGNATURES AND APPROVALS

Complainant requests that Defendant, subject to bail or conditions of release, be:
(1) arrested or that other lawful steps be taken to obtain Defendant's appearance in court; or
(2) detained, if already in custody, pending further proceedings; and that said Defendant otherwise be dealt with according to law.
