**COMPLAINT**

Order of Detention

The Complainant submits this complaint to the Court and states that there is probable cause to believe Defendant committed the following offense(s):

**COUNT I**

**Charge: Drugs - 5th Degree - Possess Schedule 1,2,3,4 - Not Small Amount Marijuana**

Minnesota Statute: 152.025.2(a)(1)

Maximum Sentence: 5 years and/or \$10,000

Offense Level: Felony

Offense Date (on or about): 06/03/2016

Control #(ICR#): 16016354

Charge Description: Bradley Michael Marek

On or about June 3, 2016, in the County of Blue Earth, said Defendant, Bradley Michael Marek did unlawfully possess one or more mixtures containing a controlled substance classified in schedule I, II, III, or IV, except a small amount of marijuana.

**COUNT II**

**Charge: Pharmacy - Possess/Control/Manufacture/Sell/Furnish/Dispense/Dispose of Hypodermic Syringes/Needles**

Minnesota Statute: 151.40.1, with reference to: 151.29

Maximum Sentence: 90 days and/or \$1,000

Offense Level: Misdemeanor

Offense Date (on or about): 06/03/2016

Control #(ICR#): 16016354

Charge Description: Bradley Michael Marek

On or about June 3, 2016, in the County of Blue Earth said Defendant, Bradley Michael Marek did, possess, control, manufacture, sell, furnish, dispense, or otherwise dispose of hypodermic syringes or

needles or any instrument or implement which can be adapted for subcutaneous injections.

## STATEMENT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

On June 3 at approximately 10:54 a.m., Officer Kelly Wood with the Mankato Department of Public Safety assisted Blue Earth County Probation with a probationary check of clients and to stand by for safety purposes.

The client was identified as Bradley Michael Marek. Probation agents also informed Officer Wood that a male, later identified as Jeremy Richard Ullrich, who is also on probation, may be present and living at the residence. Officer Wood arrived at the Mankato address and made contact with Witness 1, who informed Officer Wood that Marek was in the basement. Witness 1 gave Blue Earth County Probation consent to enter the residence and make contact with Marek.

Witness 1 stood at the top of the stairs and yelled down to the basement for Marek to come upstairs. Witness 1 next led the probation agent and Officer Wood down the stairs into the basement and showed them to Marek's room. Marek and his girlfriend, later identified as Cassy Jean Lillo, exited the room. Marek was led to the downstairs bathroom so he could provide a urine sample at the request of probation.

Blue Earth County Probation asked Witness 1 if Ullrich was currently in the residence. Witness 1 was uncertain but went to the room opposite of Marek's and knocked several times. A voice then answered from within the room; and Witness 1 told Ullrich, "Someone is here to see you." Several minutes later, Ullrich removed from his room; and probation escorted Ullrich to the bathroom to provide a urine sample. Ullrich appeared nervous and fidgety. Officer Melissa Myers performed a pat search of Ullrich for Officer Safety and stood by while probation collected the urine samples.

During the course of their duties, probation stepped inside Ullrich's room and discovered a couple of containers holding small plastic baggies filled with a crystalized substance and also baggies inside of the pockets of brown shorts on Ullrich's bed. Probation stopped the search of Ullrich's room at that time, believing the substance to be narcotics. Probation alerted Mankato officers to the discovery, and Blue Earth County Probation brought Mankato officers two containers which each held five clear plastic baggies containing the crystalized substance. This substance field tested positive for methamphetamine. Ullrich was taken into custody and placed in handcuffs.

Marek admitted to Blue Earth County Probation that there was a syringe in his room and further admitted that he had been using narcotics. Probation advised they also believed that Lillo was on probation with the Department of Corrections, and Lillo was put in phone contact with her probation agent and admitted to using narcotics. Officers monitored Marek and Lillo in the basement common area while probation stepped inside Marek's room and located a syringe and spoon with residue. Probation stopped the search of Marek's room at that time and provided the spoon to law enforcement, who field tested it. The residue on the spoon field tested positive for methamphetamine.

Based on the narcotics located in the two bedrooms, Agent Sam McGinnis with the Minnesota River Valley Drug Task Force was notified and arrived on scene after executing a search warrant for the residence.

Marek's family members indicated that they had to get a key to the door to the room where Ullrich had been staying and informed officers that Ullrich had installed the deadbolt lock on the door to the room. Agent McGinnis took photographs of Ullrich and Marek's individual bedrooms and located and took possession of the following items from Ullrich's room: 2.9 grams of a crystalized substance found in a red pouch on Ullrich's bed next to a pair of brown shorts; three digital scales found throughout the bedroom and next to the brown shorts; miscellaneous drug paraphernalia, including glass pipes, numerous gem-style baggies (new and old), numerous hypodermic needles; three prescription pill bottles belonging to Ullrich; \$422.00 in

U.S. currency found in a brown pair of shorts on the bed. Agent McGinnis also took control of the purported methamphetamine probation had found in the brown shorts on Ullrich's bed. In those shorts, Agent McGinnis located Jeremy Ullrich's wallet containing his Minnesota ID card and other miscellaneous items containing his name.

The baggies all later field tested positive for methamphetamine. In total, there was 39.4 grams of methamphetamine located in Jeremy Ullrich's room, most of it in his pants pocket with his wallet and the \$422.00.

In Marek's and Lillo's shared bedroom, Agent McGinnis located 1.2 grams of a crystalized substance in a small green container which field tested positive for methamphetamine in a dresser drawer with prescription medication bottles belonging to Lillo, a large stack of new gem-style baggies on top of the dresser, a digital scale which field tested positive for methamphetamine, and baggies containing methamphetamine residue as well as a metal spoon which field tested positive. Several hypodermic needles were also later disposed of.

## SIGNATURES AND APPROVALS

Complainant requests that Defendant, subject to bail or conditions of release, be:  
(1) arrested or that other lawful steps be taken to obtain Defendant's appearance in court; or  
(2) detained, if already in custody, pending further proceedings; and that said Defendant otherwise be dealt with according to law.
