COMPLAINT

Order of Detention

The Complainant submits this complaint to the Court and states that there is probable cause to believe Defendant committed the following offense(s):

COUNT I

Charge: Drugs - 3rd Degree - Possess - Methamphet/Amphetamine in School/Park/Pub Housing Zone

Minnesota Statute: 152.023.2(a)(6), with reference to: 152.023.3(a)
Maximum Sentence: 20 years and/or \$250,000
Offense Level: Felony

Offense Date (on or about): 12/06/2015

Control #(ICR#): 15038552

Charge Description: Noah Allan Harazin

On or about December 6, 2015 in the City of Mankato, County of Blue Earth, said Defendant, Noah Allan Harazin did unlawfully possesses one or more mixtures containing methamphetamine or amphetamine in a school zone, a park zone a public housing zone, or a drug treatment facility.

COUNT II

Charge: Drugs - 5th Degree - Possess Schedule 1,2,3,4 - Not Small Amount Marijuana

Minnesota Statute: 152.025.2(a)(1)
Maximum Sentence: 5 years and/or \$10,000
Offense Level: Felony

Offense Date (on or about): 12/06/2015

Charge Description: Noah Allan Harazin

On or about December 6, 2015, in the County of Blue Earth, said Defendant, Noah Allan Harazin did unlawfully possess one or more mixtures containing a controlled substance classified in schedule I, II, III,

or IV, except a small amount of marijuana.

STATEMENT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

Mankato Department of Public Safety Police Officer Justin Lindmeyer states that on December 6, 2015, at approximately 9:26 p.m., multiple members of the Mankato Department of Public Safety and assisting agencies went to the area of Subway, on Sibley Park Way, in the City of Mankato, in reference to searching for a robbery suspect. Officer Lindmeyer and other officers were assigned to stay in the area and look for anyone or anything suspicious that may be associated with the robbery.

Approximately 11:01 p.m., Officer Lindmeyer was driving east in the 500 block of West Pleasant Street when he observed a lighter flicker inside of a parked vehicle. The vehicle was emitting exhaust, no lights were on, and it was occupied by at least two people. Officer Lindmeyer observed that there was no one standing outside of the vehicle or walking to and from the vehicle and no nearby house had an outside light on. Officer Lindmeyer determined that the lack of any activity around the area of the vehicle and the fact it was parked and running was suspicious.

Officer Lindmeyer went to the end of the block, made a U-turn, and re-approached the vehicle from beyond. Again, he did not see any movement outside or near the area of the vehicle. He stopped beyond the vehicle and activated his squad car emergency lights to investigate what the vehicle and occupants were doing in the area.

Officer Lindmeyer approached the vehicle on the driver's side and observed four people, one including a male who matched the general description of the robbery suspect. Officer Lindmeyer asked the remaining occupants for identification, and they all presented identification without question. All the occupants had addresses from the Faribault area. Officer Lindmeyer asked the backseat passenger, identified as Noah Allan Harazin, what they were doing. Harazin advised his cousin lived at the residence and they were waiting for him. Officer Lindmeyer approached the residence with Harazin who subsequently stated his cousin was no longer there and must have run out the back door.

Officer Lindmeyer had a dispatcher check the information for Harazin and learned he had three warrants for his arrest. Officer Lindmeyer walked Harazin to the back of his squad car and Harazin notified him he had a knife on his hip. Officer Lindmeyer removed the knife and conducted the search of his person. While patting the outside of the upper left pocket of the jacket Harazin was wearing, Officer Lindmeyer felt a long tube that was similar to a pipe. He then located a plastic tube that contained a white powdery substance in it. The substance looked like the residue of methamphetamine which subsequently field-tested positive for the presence of methamphetamine. Officer Lindmeyer noted that he made contact with Harazin within one city block of Mankato West High School and Stoltzman Road City Park.

SIGNATURES AND APPROVALS

Complainant requests that Defendant, subject to bail or conditions of release, be:
(1) arrested or that other lawful steps be taken to obtain Defendant's appearance in court; or
(2) detained, if already in custody, pending further proceedings; and that said Defendant otherwise be dealt with according to law.
