The Complainant submits this complaint to the Court and states that there is probable cause to believe Defendant committed the following offense(s):

COUNT I

Charge: Domestic Assault-Misdemeanor-Intentionally Inflicts/Attempts to Inflict Bodily Harm on Another

Minnesota Statute: 609.2242.1(2)
Maximum Sentence: 90 days and/or \$1,000
Offense Level: Misdemeanor

Offense Date (on or about): 09/08/2016

Charge Description: Sara Marie McMichael

On or about September 8, 2016, in the County of Blue Earth, said Defendant, Sara Marie McMichael did, against a family or household member, as defined in M.S.A. 518B.01 Subd. 2, intentionally inflicted or attempt to inflict bodily harm upon another.

COUNT II

Charge: Disorderly Conduct-Brawling or Fighting

Minnesota Statute: 609.72.1(1)
Maximum Sentence: 90 days and/or \$1,000
Offense Level: Misdemeanor

On or about September 8, 2016, in the County of Blue Earth, said Defendant, Sara Marie McMichael did, in a public or private place, knowingly, or having reasonable grounds to know it will, or will tend to, alarm,

anger or disturb others or provoke an assault or breach of the peace, engaged in brawling or fighting.

STATEMENT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

On September 8, 2016, at approximately 6:29 p.m., Deputy Tom Cusey and Deputy Scott Wolfe, with the Blue Earth County Sheriff's Office, responded to Residence 1 in the City of Mankato in regards to a 911 call. The 911 caller, Juvenile 1, indicated there was a domestic abuse in progress and that both individuals were actively fighting.

On arrival, deputies met with Juvenile 1 as he exited the residence. He stated that the two individuals were still inside the house and they were fighting. He allowed the deputies to enter the home. Deputy Wolfe immediately observed a male party, later identified as Joshua Trost, sitting in a recliner in the living room. Deputy Cusey entered the hallway to locate the female party, who was later identified as Sara McMichael.

It was obvious to Deputy Wolfe that some sort of physical struggle had occurred because he could observe blood in Trost's right ear and on the side of his face. Deputy Wolfe asked Trost what had occurred prior to their arrival. Trost informed the deputy that he and McMichael had been involved in a relationship for approximately a year and that they had broken up last night.

Trost went on to state that when he got home from work today, he told McMichael he was going to take the pickup truck and go fishing. Because the truck was in McMichael's name, she told him that she was not going to allow him to take it. An argument ensued regarding who pays for what and escalated into a physical confrontation. Trost stated McMichael became enraged and began to hammer fist him on his face. At this point, he explained that he pushed her away from him and they both fell to the floor.

Trost stated he happened to fall on top of McMichael and held her down on the floor, yelling at her to stop. After a period of time, he got up and walked outside onto the deck. He explained that McMichael followed him out onto the deck and continued yelling at him. He then went inside the residence and walked into the bathroom to get away from McMichael and to use the facilities. When he came out of the bedroom, McMichael had stopped yelling and was not in the living room anymore. That is when he took a seat in the recliner and law enforcement arrived a short time later.

Deputy Wolfe had Trost walk out to his squad car so he could take pictures of his face and ear. While outside, Trost met with Deputy Cusey.

Deputy Cusey had learned from McMichael that she and Trost have been in a relationship for approximately three years and they don't have any children in common. She explained that there were five individuals living inside the residence, include her and Trost. McMichael stated that this incident was in regards to an ongoing dispute in which she believes that Trost lies about where he is and who he is with.

McMichael has been tracking Trost through the cell phone that she pays for. Trost found out and turned the tracking application off. McMichael found out the tracking application had been turned off and she then deactivated the cell phone. Trost was able to reactivate it. McMichael was also upset at Trost because he was supposed to take Juvenile 1 to a Blink 182 concert in the cities but then changed his mind at the last minute.

McMichael explained that she and Trost were arguing about who pays for bills and who pays for what. McMichael stated that Trost got into her face and she admitted that she took both of her hands and began to strike him in the head. She stated that she didn't know what she had in her hands when she struck him.

After hitting Trost in the head, McMichael stated that Trost retaliated by pushing her to the ground and choking her. McMichael stated that he placed his elbow up against her cheek/neck and in an upward

direction. She stated she couldn't breathe. McMichael didn't have any visible bruising at the time, but she suspected bruises would appear the following day.

Before transporting Trost and McMichael to the Blue Earth County Jail, Deputy Cusey briefly spoke with Juvenile 1. Juvenile indicated that McMichael was lying on the bed in her bedroom when Trost came in and threw the cell phone on the bed. Trost left and went into the living room, only to be followed by McMichael. Juvenile 1 heard them arguing. Juvenile 1 could see McMichael striking Trost in the chest with both hands. He stated he didn't feel safe and proceeded to go downstairs. He stated as he was walking through the living room, he observed Trost on top of McMichael. Juvenile 1 overheard Trost say two times, 'you want to die, bitch?' Juvenile 1 then called 911.

Trost has a prior qualified domestic violence related conviction within the last 10 years for Interference with a 911 Call and Domestic Assault. The conviction is found in Blue Earth County Court File No.: 07-CR-10-615.

SIGNATURES AND APPROVALS

Complainant requests that Defendant, subject to bail or conditions of release, be:
(1) arrested or that other lawful steps be taken to obtain Defendant's appearance in court; or
(2) detained, if already in custody, pending further proceedings; and that said Defendant otherwise be dealt with according to law.
