COMPLAINT

Summons

The Complainant submits this complaint to the Court and states that there is probable cause to believe Defendant committed the following offense(s):

COUNT I

Charge: Burglary-1st Deg-Dwelling-Occupied-Non-Accomplice Present

Minnesota Statute: 609.582.1(a)

Maximum Sentence: 20 years and/or \$35,000

Offense Level: Felony

Offense Date (on or about): 02/27/2016

Control #(ICR#): 16005676

Charge Description: Luke Robert Olson

On or about February 27, 2016, in the County of Blue Earth, said Defendant, Luke Robert Olson, did enter a building without consent and with intent to commit a crime, or entered a building without consent and committed a crime while in the building, either directly or as an accomplice, and the building is a dwelling and another person, not an accomplice, is present in it when the burglar enters or at any time while burglar is in the building.

COUNT II

Charge: Disorderly Conduct-Offensive/Abusive/Noisy/Obscene

Minnesota Statute: 609.72.1(3)

Maximum Sentence: 90 days and/or \$1,000

Offense Level: Misdemeanor

Offense Date (on or about): 02/27/2016

Charge Description: Luke Robert Olson

On or about February 27, 2016, in the County of Blue Earth, said Defendant, Luke Robert Olson did, in a

public or private place, knowingly, or having reasonable grounds to know it will, or will tend to, alarm, anger or disturb others or provoke an assault or breach of the peace, engaged in offensive, obscene, abusive, boisterous, or noisy conduct or in offensive, obscene, or abusive language tending reasonably to arouse alarm, anger, or resentment in others.

STATEMENT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

On February 27, 2016, at approximately 10:52 p.m., Officers Jake Green and Matt Vitale of the Mankato Department of Public Safety were dispatched to a residence in Mankato, Blue Earth County, on the report of a female resident who was home alone in her apartment and an unknown male was inside. Dispatch advised that the female had locked herself in the bedroom, and the unidentified male was banging on her door.

Upon arriving at the scene, Officer Vitale attempted to enter the front door of the apartment; however, it was locked. The apartment was on the first floor, so officers surrounded the windows to ensure no one would escape. Officer Vitale began banging on the front door; however, no one answered. Officers then advised dispatch to have the female open her bedroom window so officers could gain entry. At that time, the front door was unlocked from the inside. Officer Vitale believed Adult 1, the female inside, had run to unlock the door and then ran back to her room.

Officer Vitale opened the door and entered the apartment. Officer Vitale observed a male, later identified as Luke Robert Olson, D.O.B. 12-24-1993, lying on the couch. Olson was wearing only a t-shirt and boxers. Officer Vitale ordered him to put his hands up, and Olson complied. Officer Gagnon found Olson's boots, jeans, and black sweatshirt in a pile in the corner of the living room. Officer Vitale assisted Olson to his squad car and advised Olson of his Miranda rights. Olson stated he understood his rights and agreed to talk to Officer Vitale; however, Olson was extremely intoxicated and was often incoherent. Olson claimed he thought he was in his own apartment and that he did not know the girls who lived in the apartment he was actually in. Olson claims he did not know his local address or phone number. A preliminary breath test resulted in a reported value of 0.214.

Officer Green made contact with Adult 1, who stated she had been in her bedroom watching a movie with the door locked. Adult 1 stated her roommates had gone out for the night. Adult 1 heard her front door open and a male, who she believed to be Olson, saying, "You guys can stay here tonight." She then heard other males laugh and then the front door closed. Adult 1 heard someone start walking around her apartment, and she could hear Olson walking through all the bedrooms and then attempt to open her door. At that time, Adult 1 called the police.

Olson began banging on Adult 1's door; however, Adult 1 did not respond. Olson then began running into the door, which Adult 1 believed was Olson trying to shoulder in the door. Olson then stopped, said "You're welcome," and walked back into the living room. Adult 1 said that's when the police arrived. Adult 1 stated Olson did not have permission to be in her apartment. Adult 1 was shaking and was very frightened.

SIGNATURES AND APPROVALS

Complainant requests that Defendant, subject to bail or conditions of release, be:
(1) arrested or that other lawful steps be taken to obtain Defendant's appearance in court; or
(2) detained, if already in custody, pending further proceedings; and that said Defendant otherwise be dealt with according to law.
