**COMPLAINT**

The Complainant submits this complaint to the Court and states that there is probable cause to believe Defendant committed the following offense(s):

**COUNT I**

**Charge: Damage to Prop-1st Deg-Value Reduced Over \$1000**

Minnesota Statute: 609.595.1(3), with reference to: 609.05.1

Maximum Sentence: 5 years and/or \$10,000

Offense Level: Felony

Offense Date (on or about): 04/03/2016

Control #(ICR#): 16009465

Charge Description: Evelyn M Larson Also Known As Evelyne Marie Larson

On or about April 3, 2016, in the County of Blue Earth, said Defendant, Evelyn M Larson did intentionally aid, advise, hire, counsel, or conspire with, or otherwise procure another to commit the crime, and/or did personally commit said crime; to wit: did cause damage to another person's physical property without the other person's consent, and the damage reduced the value of the property by more that \$1,000.00, as measured by the cost of repair and replacement.

**COUNT II**

**Charge: Traffic - Underage drinking and driving; Crime described**

Minnesota Statute: 169A.33.2, with reference to: 169A.33.3

Maximum Sentence: 90 days and/or \$1,000

Offense Level: Misdemeanor

On or about April 3, 2016, in the County of Blue Earth, said Defendant, Evelyn M Larson did , while under

the age of 21 years, drive, operate, or was in physical control of a motor vehicle while consuming alcoholic beverages, or after having consumed alcoholic beverages while there is physical evidence of the consumption present in the person's body.

### **COUNT III**

**Charge: Liquor-Consumption by persons under 21**

Minnesota Statute: 340A.503.1(a)(2), with reference to: 340A.703

Maximum Sentence: 90 days and/or \$1,000

Offense Level: Misdemeanor

On or about April 3, 2016, in the County of Blue Earth, said Defendant, Evelyn M Larson did, while under the age of 21 years, consume an alcoholic beverage.

## STATEMENT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

On April 3, 2016, at approximately 12:50 a.m., officers with the Mankato Department of Public Safety were sent to the 500 block of North Broad Street on a report of a group of five males and females damaging a parked vehicle there. Dispatch advised that Complainant, an adult female, had woke up to the sound of breaking glass. Dispatch said the suspects were leaving in a blue/green van. While officers were in route to the location, dispatch said the suspects had returned; and Complainant provided a license plate of the van of 598DYR. Dispatch advised that the van purposely struck the parked vehicle, a Mercury, again and fled the scene. Officer Fischbach located the van a couple blocks away and stopped it.

Sergeant Knutson went to the scene and located the damaged vehicle, a 1999 Mercury Sable. Sergeant Knutson noted that both taillights were broken out, the rear windshield was destroyed, and there was paint transfer and scraping on the vehicle bumper. Officer Terry later made contact with the damaged vehicle's owner, Victim 1, and the owner's daughter, Victim 2. Victim 2 advised that she parked the vehicle at the location in which it was damaged at approximately 10:00 p.m. on April 2, 2016, and that on April 3, 2016, at approximately 9:50 a.m., Victim 2 discovered the damage to her vehicle. Victim 2 advised that she suspected a classmate, Zoe Lee Blaisdell, D.O.B. 2-6-1998, of damaging the vehicle. Victim 2 stated that Victim 2 has been having problems with Blaisdell at school and, most recently, because Blaisdell's boyfriend has been talking to Victim 2. While inspecting the damage to the vehicle, Officer Terry discovered an empty bottle of "Mike's Blood Orange" alcoholic beverage in the back seat of the vehicle. Officer Terry noted that it appeared as though the bottle was thrown through the back window of the vehicle. Officer Terry collected the bottle as evidence. The owner of the vehicle indicated she wished to pursue charges. On April 8, 2016, Sergeant Knutson spoke with Victim 1. Victim 1 advised that she had damage estimates for the Mercury. Sergeant Knutson obtained copies of the damage estimates and noted that the damage totals \$1,331.00.

While on the scene, Sergeant Knutson spoke with Complainant. Complainant provided the following information: Complainant was sleeping and woke up to the sound of glass breaking. Complainant looked outside to the street and saw a group of five males and females standing around the Mercury. Complainant said there was a blue/green minivan parked nearby. Complainant said she heard someone in the group say "smash the window" and "smash the taillights." Complainant said the taillights were smashed, and then the group got into the van and left the area. Complainant said the van returned a short time later and struck the Mercury. Complainant said the van was behind the Mercury trying to push the Mercury forward. Complainant said she went outside and identified the suspect van by Minnesota license plate. Complainant said the van left again, then turned down Elm Street. Complainant said the group of suspects appeared to be male and female in dresses and shorts, around 18 to 20 years old.

Officer Fischbach was on routine patrol when he heard the call come in. Officer Fischbach responded to the area; and while turning onto Elm Street, Officer Fischbach saw a dark blue minivan traveling westbound on Elm Street. Officer Fischbach identified the van as the suspect vehicle and conducted a U-turn in the middle of Elm Street and noticed the vehicle was no longer in sight. Officer Fischbach entered the intersection of Elm Street and North Riverfront Drive and was unable to see the suspect vehicle traveling northbound or southbound. Officer Fischbach went straight through the intersection and looked behind the buildings near the train tracks and entered the parking lot. Officer Fischbach spotted the suspect vehicle, got behind the vehicle, and the vehicle sped off quickly. Officer Fischbach activated his emergency lights and pulled the vehicle over on North Riverfront Drive.

Officer Fischbach approached the vehicle and asked the driver if the driver knew why Officer Fischbach pulled her over. The driver stated no. Officer Fischbach explained that officers received a call for some people hitting a vehicle a few blocks away. Officer Fischbach identified the driver as Evelynne Marie

Larson, D.O.B. 4-30-1997. Officer Fischbach identified the passenger behind Larson as a juvenile female with a date of birth in March 1999. Officer Fischbach contacted officers on the scene and was informed that there were approximately five people that exited the van and were taking part in smashing the vehicle. While dealing with Larson, Officer Fischbach could smell a strong odor of alcohol coming from the vehicle. Officer Fischbach asked Larson to step out of the vehicle and asked Larson what happened. Larson was sticking to the story that the group was just coming from a hotel room they were staying at the Budget Host hotel. Officer Fischbach told Larson that her story was false and that Officer Fischbach had witnesses saying the group was on North Broad Street vandalizing a vehicle. Larson stated that the group was coming from the hotel and went to Victoria Lynn Perschbacher's, D.O.B. 3-31-1998, child's father's house; and they all got into an altercation. Officer Fischbach asked what happened, and Larson said that the people at the house were threatening them and then they all started fighting. Larson indicated that all parties were hitting the vehicle.

Officer Fischbach ran Larson through standardized field sobriety tests and administered a preliminary breath test to Larson. The result of the preliminary breath test indicated an alcohol concentration of .048. Officer Fischbach placed Larson in the back of Officer Fischbach's squad car. Officer Fischbach then asked the passenger behind Larson if she would tell Officer Fischbach what happened. The passenger behind Larson said that she was sleeping in the van and did not know what happened. The passenger behind Larson said that everyone woke her up while they were getting pulled over.

Sergeant Knutson went to the scene of the traffic stop and learned that all occupants in the van were under the age of 21 and had been drinking. Officer Knutson spoke with Blaisdell, who was the front seat passenger. Blaisdell said that they were all in a room at the Budget Host hotel. Blaisdell said they left with Larson driving the van. Blaisdell said that Larson drove them to the 500 block of North Broad Street, which is where Perschbacher is living at. Blaisdell said when they arrived there, Blaisdell saw an altercation take place. Blaisdell said there was hitting, screaming, and yelling. Blaisdell said she did not see who was involved in the altercation. Blaisdell said that everyone returned to the van, and they then left the area before being stopped by police. Sergeant Knutson told Blaisdell she was not being truthful about what happened. Blaisdell's mother was on scene at this point. Sergeant Knutson asked Blaisdell who broke out the taillights and smashed out the rear windshield, and Blaisdell said she did not know. Sergeant Knutson explained that the group had left the scene and then returned and started ramming the Mercury and had damaged it then as well. Blaisdell's mother urged Blaisdell to be honest and tell the truth. Blaisdell then said that Larson was mad, so they returned to the car, and Larson struck it several times with the van. Blaisdell said that they then drove away and were stopped by police a couple blocks away. Blaisdell would not say who was involved in breaking out the taillights and smashing the windshield. Blaisdell submitted a preliminary breath test sample, which indicated an alcohol concentration of .138.

Officer Hulloper also responded to the area of the traffic stop. Officer Hulloper made contact with a passenger identified as Perschbacher. Perschbacher told Officer Hulloper that the group had been drinking at the Budget Host hotel for a birthday party. Perschbacher said they got into the van to drive to the 500 block of North Broad Street where her boyfriend lives. Perschbacher said she walked inside the house for two minutes, but the door was locked to the upstairs apartment. Perschbacher came back out of the house and got back in the van. Perschbacher said she heard someone tell the driver to hurry up and leave. Perschbacher said they got pulled over after that. Officer Hulloper told Perschbacher that Officer Hulloper knew she was lying because the vehicle left the scene and came back again. Perschbacher said she did not know anything else and would not change her story. Officer Hulloper noted that Perschbacher's eyes were bloodshot and glassy. Officer Hulloper could smell a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from Perschbacher. Perschbacher provided a preliminary breath test sample which indicated an alcohol concentration of .159.

Officer Hulloper also spoke to a back seat passenger, who was identified as a juvenile female with a

date of birth in June 1999. The back seat passenger told Officer Hullopeter that they were drinking at the Budget Host and drove to Broad Street to drop off Perschbacher. The back seat passenger said that Larson, Perschbacher, and Blaisdell got out of the car. The back seat passenger said she was in the back of the car and could not see anything. The back seat passenger said that they drove away and got pulled over. Officer Hullopeter told the back seat passenger that she was lying because the vehicle came back again. The back seat passenger mentioned that there was arguing and someone was swinging. Officer Hullopeter asked the back seat passenger to tell Officer Hullopeter more about what happened. The back seat passenger said she was in the back of the van and did not see what happened. The back seat passenger admitted to drinking and submitted a preliminary breath test sample which indicated a result of .085.

## SIGNATURES AND APPROVALS
