COMPLAINT

Summons

The Complainant submits this complaint to the Court and states that there is probable cause to believe Defendant committed the following offense(s):

COUNT I

Charge: Theft-Take/Use/Transfer Movable Prop-No Consent

Minnesota Statute: 609.52.2(a)(1)

Maximum Sentence: 90 days and/or \$1,000

Offense Level: Misdemeanor

Offense Date (on or about): 08/21/2016

Control #(ICR#): 16025095

Charge Description: Said Defendant, Penny Lane Arredondo, Also Known As Penny Arredondo Fowler, Penny Lane Fowler And Penny Lane, did intentionally and without claim of right, take, use, transfer, conceal or retain possession of the movable property of another without the other's consent and with intent to deprive the owner permanently of possession of the property.

STATEMENT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

Complainant is an Officer with the Mankato Police Department who believes the information set out below is true and accurate based on reports and information submitted to the Officer by Officer Matthew Vitale and others identified herein.

Officer Matt Vitale, a licensed peace officer in the State of Minnesota, currently employed by the Mankato Department of Public Safety, reports that on August 21, 2016, at approximately 10:16 p.m., he along with other officers responded to Wal-Mart, located in the City of Mankato, for a report of shoplifting.

Officers later learned from Wal-Mart asset protection that three females took a shopping cart containing Wal-Mart merchandise and walked past all points of sale without paying for the merchandise.

Additionally, one of the those females, identified as Penny Lane Arredondo, was also in possession of two purses which contained additional merchandise from Wal-Mart, such as DVD's, a water bottle, Sharpies, clothes, and other personal items that had not been paid for.

The purses in the possession of Arredondo were also believed to be taken from Wal-Mart and had not been paid for.

Vitale reports that the aggregate amount of the stolen items was \$464.39.

SIGNATURES AND APPROVALS

Complainant requests that Defendant, subject to bail or conditions of release, be:
(1) arrested or that other lawful steps be taken to obtain Defendant's appearance in court; or
(2) detained, if already in custody, pending further proceedings; and that said Defendant otherwise be dealt with according to law.
