The Complainant submits this complaint to the Court and states that there is probable cause to believe Defendant committed the following offense(s):

COUNT I

Charge: Drugs - 1st Degree - Sale - 17 Grams or More-Cocaine or Meth w/in 90-Day Period

Minnesota Statute: 152.021.1(1), with reference to: 152.021.3(b)

Maximum Sentence: Not less than four years nor more than 40 years and/or \$1,000,000.00

Offense Level: Felony

Offense Date (on or about): 08/12/2016

Control #(ICR#): 16024035

Charge Description: Darien Ray Flynn Also Known As Darien Ray Fylnn And Darien Flynn

On or about August 12, 2016, in the County of Blue Earth, said Defendant, Darien Ray Flynn did, within a 90 day period, unlawfully sell one or more mixtures of a total weight of 17 grams or more containing cocaine or methamphetamine; and said defendant was previously convicted of a controlled substance crime.

COUNT II

Charge: Drugs - 2nd Degree - Possess 25 grams or more cocaine or methamphetamine

Minnesota Statute: 152.022.2(a)(1), with reference to: 152.022.3(b)

Maximum Sentence: Not less than three years nor more than 40 years and/or \$500,000

Offense Level: Felony

Offense Date (on or about): 08/12/2016

Control #(ICR#): 16024035

Charge Description: Darien Ray Flynn Also Known As Darien Ray Fylnn And Darien Flynn

On or about August 12, 2016, in the County of Blue Earth, said Defendant, Darien Ray Flynn did, unlawfully possesses one or more mixtures of a total weight of 25 grams or more containing cocaine or

methamphetamine; and has a previous controlled substance conviction.

STATEMENT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

On August 12, 2016, at approximately 11:14 p.m., Officer Stoltman of the Mankato Department of Public Safety assisted officers on a traffic stop at Main Street and Division Street in the City of Mankato. Prior to the traffic stop, officers had been watching a house located on Main Street in relation to an arrest warrant to be served on Darien Ray Flynn, DOB 3-7-1993.

An officer that was watching the residence announced that a silver Chevrolet Impala had just left the residence with at least three occupants. The officer believed Flynn to be a rear passenger in the vehicle. Officer Kaiser located the vehicle traveling southbound at Main Street and Division Street and initiated a traffic stop. Officer Stoltman arrived on scene and noted Officer Mohamed and Agent McGinnis were also present on scene and talking to a male subject at the rear of the vehicle. Officer Stoltman observed three other occupants still inside the vehicle.

Officer Stoltman spoke to the male briefly in an effort to find out where they had just come from. The male told him some details about where he claimed the vehicle had come from. Officer Stoltman told the male that he would pull up the location on his phone and have him point out where they had just come from. As he was doing this, he noticed that the male, who had not yet been identified, became very nervous. Officer Stoltman noted that Agent McGinnis was working to identify the male, as officers believed he was lying to them. Officer Stoltman noted that the male was fidgety and placed one of his hands in his pants pocket. Officer Stoltman recalled Officer Mohamed telling the male to take his hands out of his pockets. Officer Stoltman asked the male if he had been patted down. The male indicated he had a lighter. Officer Stoltman started to pat down the male's front pockets as he was making him nervous by his fidgety actions and continually wanting to put his hands by his front pants pockets. Officer Stoltman told the male that he needed to make sure he did not have any weapons. As Officer Stoltman was patting down the male's front pockets, he noted that they were bulky. Officer Stoltman removed a butane lighter from the right front pants pocket, along with a pill container and a small flashlight. Officer Stoltman noted that the male started to get very tense and would not stand still. Officer Stoltman had to tell him a few times to just relax. Due to his actions, Officer Stoltman placed the male in handcuffs behind his back for officer safety and failure to identify.

Agent McGinnis came back and spoke to the male. He asked the male if he was Darien Flynn. The male stated he was Darien's oldest brother and provided the brother's name. The male stated this loudly, with conviction, as though he were adamant of what he was telling Agent McGinnis. Agent McGinnis advised that the occupants of the car stated he was, in fact, Darien Flynn. Officers eventually identified the male as Flynn.

Officer Stoltman finished patting down Flynn. Officer Stoltman felt what appeared to be the shape of a small pistol or revolver in Flynn's left pocket. Flynn told Officer Stoltman it was a knife. Officer Stoltman reached in the pocket and removed a small wooden handle revolver that folded out into a knife. Officer Stoltman went back to the right pocket and felt deeper down what resembled the feel of a bag of marijuana. He removed the bag, which turned out to be a clear plastic bag of suspected synthetic marijuana. Below the bag in the same pocket was another clear plastic bag with a crystal-like substance which later field tested positive for methamphetamine. Agent McGinnis retained the narcotics found on Flynn's person as evidence. Officers noted that approximately 32 grams of suspected methamphetamine and 22 grams of suspected synthetic marijuana were located on Flynn's person. Officers were later advised that jail staff recovered Valium from Flynn as well.

A review of Flynn's criminal history reveals a December 23, 2014 conviction for Controlled Substance Crime in the Third Degree as set forth in court file no.: 07-CR-13-4365, a June 28, 2016 conviction for

Controlled Substance Crime in the Fifth Degree as set forth in court file no.: 07-CR-15-2778, and a January 26, 2016 conviction for Controlled Substance Crime in the Fifth Degree as set forth in court file no.: 72-CR-13-215.

SIGNATURES AND APPROVALS

Complainant requests that Defendant, subject to bail or conditions of release, be:
(1) arrested or that other lawful steps be taken to obtain Defendant's appearance in court; or
(2) detained, if already in custody, pending further proceedings; and that said Defendant otherwise be dealt with according to law.
