COMPLAINT

Order of Detention

The Complainant submits this complaint to the Court and states that there is probable cause to believe Defendant committed the following offense(s):

COUNT I

Charge: Drugs - 5th Degree - Possess Schedule 1,2,3,4 - Not Small Amount Marijuana

Minnesota Statute: 152.025.2(a)(1)

Maximum Sentence: 5 years and/or \$10,000

Offense Level: Felony

Offense Date (on or about): 04/07/2016

Control #(ICR#): 16009991

Charge Description: Eric William Kump Also Known As Eric Kump

On or about April 7, 2016, in the County of Blue Earth, said Defendant, Eric William Kump did unlawfully possess one or more mixtures containing a controlled substance classified in schedule I, II, III, or IV, except a small amount of marijuana.

COUNT II

Charge: Drugs - Possess/Sale Small Amount of Marijuana - No Remuneration

Minnesota Statute: 152.027.4(a)

Maximum Sentence: \$300 fine

Offense Level: Petty Misdemeanor

Offense Date (on or about): 04/07/2016

Control #(ICR#): 16009991

Charge Description: Eric William Kump Also Known As Eric Kump

On or about April 7, 2016, in the County of Blue Earth, said Defendant, Eric William Kump did unlawfully possess a small amount of marijuana.

STATEMENT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

On April 7, 2016, at approximately 8:37 p.m., Officer Grassmann of the Mankato Department of Public Safety assisted Blue Earth County Probation with a probation check at an address located on Third Avenue in the City of Mankato reference Eric William Kump, D.O.B. 11-6-1980. Contact was made with Kump in the basement of the residence. Kump was in his bedroom at that time. Kump was advised of the reason for the contact with probation and law enforcement as was reference to a probation check. Officer Grassmann noted that Kump was sitting in a recliner chair which was located inside his bedroom. Kump was advised that a check of Kump's person and his room would be conducted by probation.

At the direction of probation, Officer Grassmann conducted a pat search of Kump's person, searching for items of contraband or weapons prior to conducting a physical search of Kump's room. During the search of Kump's person, Officer Grassmann was able to identify that there was a pouch of some sort inside the coin pocket of Kump's blue jeans. When asked, Kump stated the item in the coin pocket was not his but belonged to someone else. Kump then indicated that there were drugs inside the pouch in his pocket. Officer Grassmann removed the item from the pocket and identified it as a black pouch that could be buttoned at the top. Officer Grassmann also located two \$5.00 bills in the same coin pocket area.

Upon opening the pouch, Officer Grassmann was able to observe a small plastic baggie. Inside the baggie, Officer Grassmann saw a powdery substance that had an appearance consistent with methamphetamine. Kump indicated that the item was, indeed, methamphetamine. Kump was placed under arrest. The search of Kump's room conducted by Blue Earth County probation identified a sandwich baggie containing a green, leafy substance located in the side pocket of the recliner chair that Kump had been sitting on. The green, leafy substance had the appearance of marijuana as well as the smell consistent with marijuana. Kump indicated that he had not smoked any of the marijuana that day but that he had smoked some of the methamphetamine that was located on Kump's person.

Kump was escorted to the squad car and transported to the Blue Earth County Jail. Officer Grassmann entered the suspected marijuana and methamphetamine into evidence. Officer Grassmann conducted field tests on the methamphetamine. The test indicated a positive result for methamphetamine. Officer Grassmann also conducted a field test on the suspected marijuana, and it indicated a positive result for marijuana.

SIGNATURES AND APPROVALS

Complainant requests that Defendant, subject to bail or conditions of release, be:
(1) arrested or that other lawful steps be taken to obtain Defendant's appearance in court; or
(2) detained, if already in custody, pending further proceedings; and that said Defendant otherwise be dealt with according to law.
